






Tour Guides

Guides provide guests with forty-five minute walking tours with general information about D-Day, World War II, and the Memorial. Guided walking tours are scheduled on the hour beginning at 10:30AM with the last tour departing at 3:30PM. Additional tours are scheduled by appointment. Guides receive training prior to becoming a tour guide.



Gift Shop Attendants

Gift shop attendants may chose to volunteer as cashiers or baggers in the Memorial Store. Cashiers receive appropriate training for operating store registers. Gift store volunteers also help with merchandizing and with greeting and assisting guests during their visit.



Information Table or Welcome Booth Attendants

Information table attendants are stationed at a table on the deck of the gift store to answer general questions about the Memorial. Welcome Booth attendants greet visitors, provide directions, and count guests as they enter the monument.
