# YEAR AT A GLANCE

#### Summary

The past year was one of both recovery and expansion at the National D-Day Memorial. Following the Memorial's reopening in June 2020 after three months of closure due to the COVID-19 pandemic, a robust schedule of in-person events engaged visitors of all ages, adding to virtual programming offered consistently since March 2020. Thanks to the tireless work of volunteers and staff, as well as financial supporters worldwide, the Memorial acquired important artifacts, cultivated relationships with members and donors, prioritized high-quality educational offerings, and furthered our mission of preserving the stories of D-Day and World War II for future generations.

# CALENDAR OF EVENTS

#### September 2-13, 2020: Poppy Peace Garden

Commemorating the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II, volunteers placed 4,415 red poppies—one for each D-Day fatality— alongside our *Le Monument Aux Morts* sculpture as a visual tribute to the victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks, as well as all veterans who sacrificed their lives for the freedoms we enjoy today.

#### September 17, 2020: POW / MIA "Never Forget" Ceremony

This annual event honors POWs and the servicemen and -women who remain listed as missing in action. This year's wreath laying ceremony was live-streamed and included guests from the USA Patriots (formerly known as the Wounded Warrior Amputee Softball Team).

#### September 28-October 3, 2020: 1940s Homefront Festival

This week-long event explored American life during World War II, with each day's programming focusing on a unique theme: Rosies (Women in World War II), Civil Rights, Rationing, Patriotism, Victory Gardening, and Propaganda.

#### November 14, 2020 and March 27, 2021: Scout Day

Young participants in these two virtual events began with a live interactive program focusing on Scouts' World War II contributions, followed by a livestreamed guided tour of the Memorial.

#### December 4-6, 2020: Flames of Memory

Arranged throughout the Memorial's grounds, thousands of luminarias shone in recognition of Overlord's fallen. This moving visual display, hosted annually, pays tribute to the ultimate sacrifice each serviceman made to relight the lamp of freedom.

#### May 14-16, 2021: Virtual Armed Forces 5k Race

In support of our Armed Forces, participants nationwide took part in a patriotic-themed 5K run/walk.

#### May 31, 2021: Memorial Day

Nearly 2,300 visitors joined us for Memorial Day weekend, our first in-person event since the beginning of the pandemic. The Memorial offered a variety of both in-person and virtual commemoration activities for all ages so that guests could honor the fallen however they were most comfortable.

#### June 4-6, 2021: 77<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of D-Day Commemoration

2,000 guests celebrated the 77<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D-Day and 20 years since President George W. Bush dedicated the Memorial in 2001. The weekend's festivities included lectures from military history scholars, exhibits, children's activities, book signings, and, most importantly, an opportunity for visitors to hear the stories of D-Day, some told by the veterans who experienced them firsthand.







# SPOTLIGHT ON EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

Growth and Global Engagement Amid the COVID-19 Pandemic


Because of challenges associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, education looked different at the National D-Day Memorial during the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year. Not only was our site closed for a number of weeks, but once reopening it became clear that few schools, even if meeting in person, were able to travel for field trips. However, thanks to the creativity and hard work of our staff and volunteers, the National D-Day Memorial adapted quickly and offered new ways for guests to learn about D-Day and World War II. While still below pre-pandemic levels, signs of recovery are already visible. In addition to the continuation of regular programs for adults, school buses are once again rolling up our hill for visits, and we continue to work closely with faculty and administrators to meet the educational needs of students from kindergarten to college.

Alternative educational offerings: In response to the pandemic and inability of schools to visit, the NDDMF Education Department offered virtual programs, usually for little or no cost, to schools trying to navigate the new digital world. In one case, a middle school needed a specially designed program on aviation in World War II. The education staff quickly developed a presentation for more than 100 students over two days. In another case, a Title I elementary school near Richmond, which, at the time, had not yet reopened, requested a special video tour for students learning from home. We were pleased to work with the teachers at no cost, meeting an education need and our mission at the same time by offering guided video tours, online discussions, lectures geared to younger audiences, and even a remote summer camp experience.

Virtual outreach: NDDMF discovered a new reality during the pandemic: virtual programs attracted large audiences across a geographic footprint suddenly as large as the Internet itself. Where once inperson lectures by scholars might attract a few dozen people from an easy drive away, an online presentation could reach across the globe and be seen by audiences in the hundreds or thousands. During FY 20-21, we saw virtual "visits" from nearly every state in America, many foreign nations including the United Kingdom, France, Belgium, Thailand, Denmark, Brazil, and Spain, and several Canadian provinces. In that same 12-month period, nearly 14,000 people clicked on our videos posted on YouTube, and more than 50,000 through Facebook. Compared to pre-pandemic numbers of some 5,000 total virtual views, it is clear that we are filling a vital niche through virtual programming.



# VISION TO BUILD

The 2020-2021 Fiscal Year brought us even closer to embarking on new stages of our Capital Campaign. The coming years will see additions that will enhance visitor experience, promote sustainability, and provide greater opportunities to educate and engage the public.

# Key Projects on the Horizon Include:



#### RIDGWAY-DEMING WALKING TRAIL

Offering stunning views of the Blue Ridge Mountains, this pet-friendly, wheelchair-accessible one-mile walking trail will educate guests on the importance and use of Virginia's natural resources during World War II. It will also increase visitor time on site and serve as an added membership benefit.



#### **ROBINS AMPHITHEATER**

The Amphitheater's primary role is to provide an alternative venue to holding events on the main plaza of the Memorial itself. This will allow the Memorial to retain an added sense of repose and solemnity while reducing wear and tear. The Amphitheater will be outfitted for lectures, concerts, and performances, filling a need for a large outdoor venue in the Central Virginia and Roanoke Valley regions.



#### MOTOR POOL AND EVENT DECK

The Motor Pool, equipped with an event deck overlooking the Robins Amphitheater, will serve as additional exhibit, event, and office space for the growing National D-Day Memorial Foundation. It will also function as the future home of the Lee Holland Collection, a series of immaculately restored World War II vehicles.
