YEAR AT A GLANCE

Summary

Thanks to the tireless work of volunteers and staff, as well as financial supporters worldwide, the National D-Day Memorial has continued to flourish. New milestones were reached, including a record number of field trips, new highs in attendance, and a global achievement for our podcast. The Memorial also continued daily work toward achieving our mission of preserving the stories of D-Day and World War II for future generations.

We acquired important artifacts, cultivated relationships with members and donors, prioritized high-quality educational offerings, and continued to share this vital history with tens of thousands of people every year.















CALENDAR OF EVENTS

The Memorial hosts numerous events throughout the year, including:

September 2-13, 2022: Poppy Peace Garden

Commemorating the 78th anniversary of the end of World War II, volunteers placed 4,415 red poppies—one for each Allied fatality on D-Day— alongside our *Le Monument Aux Morts* sculpture as a visual tribute to the victims of the September 11, 2001 attacks, as well as all veterans who sacrificed their lives for the freedoms we enjoy today.

November 11, 2022: Veterans Day Ceremony

Despite a tropical storm, we gathered in the Bedford Moose Lodge #1897 to honor those who have served our country. Major General Antonio Munera, Commanding General, U.S. Army Command, was present to address the assembled crowd.

December 2-4, 2022: Flames of Memory

Arranged throughout the Memorial's grounds, thousands of luminarias shone in recognition of Overlord's fallen. This moving visual display, hosted annually, pays tribute to the ultimate sacrifice each serviceman made to relight the lamp of freedom.

April 22, 2023: Family Day

This joyous family-friendly event focused on exploring life at home and on the front lines during World War II. Family Day featured artifact displays, demonstrations, children's activities, living historians, musical performances, and special tours.

May 26, 2023: Stars and Stripes Forever Patriotic Concert

This annual tradition featured the Jefferson Choral Society and The Let's Dance Band. The stirring concert had guests on their feet celebrating freedom and honoring those who gave all to secure it.

May 29, 2023: Memorial Day Commemoration

Due to inclement weather, the Memorial Day Commemoration was held inside the Bobbie G. Johnson Pavilion and live streamed to visitors from around the world. We were honored to hear from Rear Admiral Michael J. Steffen and Lt. Governor Winsome Earle-Sears during this moving ceremony to honor those who paid the ultimate price for our freedom.

June 6, 2023: 79th Anniversary of D-Day Commemoration

Our 2023 commemoration featured remarks from Governor Glenn Youngkin, Maj. General Timothy Williams, Dr. John C. McManus, Kevin Hymel, and George Patton "Pat" Waters. We were also honored to host eight World War II veterans for the ceremony.

A Fitting Tribute to D-Day:







More than 6,600 people visited the Memorial or watched virtually June 6, 2023 in honor of the 79th anniversary of the Normandy landings. We were joined by Virginia Governor Glenn Youngkin; authors Kevin Hymel and Dr. John C. McManus; and George Patton "Pat" Waters, grandson of General Patton. Most importantly, we were honored to be joined by eight World War II veterans, all well into their 90s. Their presence was an inspiring reminder of the dwindling generation who won a war, vanquished tyranny in Europe, and then returned home to build modern America.

After much anticipation, the Foundation dedicated a portion of the Ridgway-Deming Walking Trail, with eager supporters strolling the wooded footpath following the ribbon cutting. Finally, a live recording of the *Someone Talked!* podcast was held, along with book signings and our annual "You Shall Never Be Forgotten" ceremony.

It was in every way a fitting tribute, leaving those in attendance eagerly anticipating the major commemoration of the 80th Anniversary in June 2024!





Revenue and Contributions





VISION TO BUILD

The 2022-2023 Fiscal Year brought us even closer to embarking on new stages of our Capital Campaign. The coming years will see additions that will enhance visitor experience, promote sustainability, and provide greater opportunities to educate and engage the public.

Key Projects on the Horizon Include:





RIDGWAY-DEMING WALKING TRAIL

While half of the trail was dedicated June 6, 2023, we still have half the project to complete! This pet-friendly, wheelchair-accessible, one-mile walking trail will educate guests on the importance and use of Virginia's natural resources during World War II. It will also increase visitor time on site and serve as an added membership benefit.

ROBINS PERFORMANCE AMPHITHEATER

The Amphitheater's primary role is to provide an alternative venue to holding events on the main plaza. This will allow the Memorial to retain an added sense of repose and solemnity while reducing wear and tear. The Amphitheater will be outfitted for lectures, concerts, and performances, filling a need for a large outdoor venue in Bedford.

DORIS AND JOHN FOWLER FAMILY MOTOR POOL



The Motor Pool, equipped with an event deck overlooking the Amphitheater, will serve as additional exhibit, event, and temporary office space for the growing National D-Day Memorial Foundation. It will also function as the future home of the Lee Holland Collection, a series of immaculately restored World War II vehicles.

Chair of the D-Day Society, George Patton "Pat" Waters



George Patton "Pat" Waters was born in New York City on January 18, 1941 to General John K. Waters and Beatrice Patton Waters, the first-born daughter of General and Mrs. George S. Patton Jr. He graduated from Pfeiffer College in North Carolina in 1965 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy Reserve that same year, attending Officer Candidate's School. He served aboard the destroyer USS Braine as Combat Information Officer for a three-year tour of the Western Pacific and as an instructor in Anti-Submarine Warfare at Glynco

(GA) Naval Air Station. Following his naval service, he worked as an executive in a Coca-Cola bottling plant in Louisiana before starting Waters Investments, LLC. He has served as a board member of the Congressional Medal of Honor Foundation, Patriots' Point Development Authority, the USS Yorktown Foundation and now serves as Chair of the D-Day Society for the National D-Day Memorial.
